Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical personnel determined the child sustained injures that were non-accidental in nature. The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect, physical abuse and emotional abuse to the child by the father and stepmother. Medical personnel determined the child's injuries were consistent with physical abuse and neglect. The child, her half-siblings and stepsiblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-of-home care. The child, the child's 14-year-old stepsibling, and 12-year-old stepsibling were placed with separate relative caregivers. The child's 6-year-old half-sibling, 3-year-old half-sibling, 2-year-old half-sibling and 1-year-old half-sibling were placed in non-relative foster homes.
