At the time of the incident, the agency was assessing the October 31, 2018 CPS report. The last contact by the agency was a visit with the infant and his 2-year-old half-sister in the home where their mother was staying on November 13, 2018.

On October 31, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant by his mother. The infant died during the assessment period and an additional report was made to the agency on December 7, 2018. An assessment was completed by the agency and the initial allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated.

On June 11, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant and his now 2-year-old half-sister by their mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained injuries consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant and his 3-month-old and 5-year-old brothers were deemed unsafe and the agency implemented an in-home safety plan allowing for the children to be safely cared for by their mother. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
