An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The infant's now adult half-sibling was deemed unsafe and the case was opened to provide ongoing case management services.

On March 19, 2002, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse by the infant's father to the infant's now adult half-sibling. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the mother. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death of infant was due to intoxication of methadone. The agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the father. The agency determined the infant's 2-year-old sibling safe with his father and he remained in the home with the father. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Accecement

## 90-Day Summary Report for Child Death, Serious Injury or Egregious Incident Case #190127DSP-EauCl-894

The Wisconsin Department of Children and Families, as required by 2009 Wisconsin Act 78 (Section 49.981(7)(cr), Stats.), makes available to the public, a 90-day summary report for cases involving child death, serious injury, and egregious incidents involving abuse or neglect. Under these statutory provisions, the posting of information which potentially interferes with or jeopardizes the integrity of an investigation or trial is exempt from the public disclosure requirement.

The Department has determined that releasing the summary report would jeopardize an ongoing criminal proceeding, and is delaying posting as provided under Wis. Stat. § 48.981(7)(cr)7. The Department will release the 90-day summary once the investigation and/or trial has been concluded.
