As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the child's father and the father's girlfriend were arrested and criminally charged with Child Abuse – Intentionally Cause Harm. Medical personnel determined the infants sustained injuries consistent with non-accidental trauma. At the time of the incident, the infants and their half-sibling were receiving services from the agency under an Order for Protection or Services. The infants were residing in their home and the infants' half-sibling was residing in a foster home.
