Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:  On April 22, 2019, the agency received a report regarding a 5-month-old infant who was brought to the hospital and subsequently pronounced deceased on April 24, 2019. The Medical Examiner's Office determined that the infant had suffered injuries to the head and body that were non-accidental in nature. During the course of a medical examination conducted as a part of the agency's assessment, the infant's 2-year-old half-sibling was also determined to have injuries to the head and body that were non-accidental in nature. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's significant other was arrested and criminally charged with 1st-Degree Reckless Homicide, Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death), Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Harm, and Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Bodily Harm). A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:  The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse and neglect to the 5-month-old infant by the mother's significant other, maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the infant's mother, and maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death of the 5-mont-old infant was due to non-accidental head trauma.
