On April 26, 2019, the agency received a report regarding a child pronounced deceased in the hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the child sustained injuries that were non-accidental in nature. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by an unknown maltreater. At the time of the child's death, four other children were living in the home with the child's biological mother and stepfather. Those children were deemed unsafe and now reside with their grandparents. The family was referred to services and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On June 5, 2019, the agency received a report regarding a 2-month-old infant brought to the hospital unresponsive and subsequently pronounced deceased. Medical personnel determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the father was arrested and criminally charged with 1st-Degree Reckless Homicide. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father and to substantiate neglect to the infant by the mother. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained head injuries consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant's siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case manager services.
