K: 67% of students will reach the benchmark of D (instructional) on the Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment by the end of the 2018 - 2019 school year. We had 67% reach the benchmark. (Met)

1st: 70% of students will reach the benchmark of J (instructional) on the Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment by the end of the 2018 - 2019 school year.

We had 61% reach the benchmark. (Not Met)

2nd: 75% of students will reach the benchmark of M (instructional) on the Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment by the end of the 2018 - 2019 school year. We had 74% reach the benchmark. (Not Met)

MATH

4K: 78% of students will reach the benchmark of (Level 1) or higher on the Number Identification subtest of the Number Development Assessment by the end of the 2018-2019 school year.

We had 59% of the students reach the benchmark. (Not Met)

K: 70% of students will reach the benchmark of (Level 2) or higher on the summary score of the Number Development Assessment (Part I) by the end of the 2018-2019 school year. We had 93% reach the benchmark (Met)

1st: 50% of students will reach the benchmark of a Level 4 on the Fact Fluency Addition Assessment and 18% of students will reach the benchmark of a Level 5 on the Fact Fluency Subtraction Assessment by the end of the 2018-2019 school year.

We had 56% reach the addition benchmark (Met) We had 22% reach the subtraction benchmark (Met)

2nd: 53% of students will reach the benchmark of a Level 5 on the Fact Fluency Addition Assessment and 22% of students will reach the benchmark of a 7 on the subtraction Fact Fluency Assessment by the end of the 2018-2019 school year.
