On March 6, 2020, the agency received a report regarding a 3-year-old child pronounced deceased in his home. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother was criminally charged with Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death). A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother and neglect of the child by the father. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental trauma. The agency deemed the child's 4-year-old and 1-year-old siblings unsafe. The siblings were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with relatives. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On March 9, 2020, the agency received a report regarding a 1-year-old infant who was brought to the hospital with multiple injuries on March 7, 2020. The infant was later pronounced deceased on March 9, 2020. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's boyfriend was arrested and criminally charged with 1st Degree Reckless Homicide. On June 12, 2020, the agency received a report regarding a 3-month-old infant brought to the hospital with head injuries; the infant passed away in the hospital on June 14, 2020. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death to be the result of non-accidental head trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the father was criminally charged with one count of 1st Degree Reckless Homicide and one count of Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death).
