Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On January 1, 2020, the agency received a report regarding a 1-year-old infant pronounced deceased in his home. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's office determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's boyfriend was arrested and criminally charged with 1st-Degree Reckless Homicide, Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death), and Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the mother's boyfriend. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant's cousin, aunt, and uncle, who are minor children and resided in the same home, were deemed safe in the care of their mothers, the infant's adult aunt and grandmother, respectively. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment and no services referrals were made.
