WHENE'S, the Industrial Commission of Misconsin has, for many years, administered all federally aided apprenticeship and on-the-job training progress in Misconsin under authority vested in them by the Governor through section 101.34 and 101.343 of the Misconsin Statutes; and

WHEREAS, such training programs are of extreme importance to the accial and economic welfare of the State of Visconsin and the Industrial Commission is the state agency most qualified by function and experience to administer such programs; and

WHEREAS, the importance of the State's apprenticeship and on-the-job training programs is such that a review should be undertaken by the Commission to ascertain the effectiveness of existing programs providing the opportunities and skills needed in our industries. Such a study should include a review of the length and content of training programs, qualifications to enter apprentice-ship programs, and the availability of training opportunities:

THEREFORE, I, Warren F. Knowles, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by Executive Order hereby west in the Industrial Commission of Wisconsin sole authority to administer all local, state, and federally aided apprenticeship and on-the-job training programs in Wisconsin excepting high school cooperative education and work study programs and vocational agricultural on-the-job programs. The Commission is directed to undertake complete cooperation with all public vocational schools in Wisconsin where related technical instruction combined with on-the-job training is needed to produce the most highly skilled and technically qualified person.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have become set my head and caused the Great Seal of the State of Visconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Hudison this thirty-first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand sine hundred and sixty-six.
