

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 46, issued in August 1972, directed the creation of a new Governor's Committee on Migratory Labor and defined its basic objectives; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with that order, a new Committee was recently appointed, composed of seven persons who belong to organizations that serve migrant workers, seven persons associated with businesses that employ them, seven public members and four state legislators; and which includes a number of former migrant workers; and

WHEREAS, a Technical-Advisory Committee was created consisting of representatives of the Department of Health and Social Services, the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations, the Department of Public Instruction, the Department of Local Affairs and Development, the Department of Justice, the Department of Transportation, the Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, the Council on Criminal Justice and the University of Wisconsin System;

NOW, THEREFORE, I PATRICK J. LUCEY, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby charge the Governor's Committee on Migratory Labor and its Technical-Advisory Committee as follows:

- I. The Committee shall advise the Governor, the Legislature, and state officials by formulating policies and programs which would serve to alleviate the particular difficulties encountered by migrant workers in Wisconsin, both in their living and working conditions. The Committee shall also be of assistance to businesses which employ migrant workers by suggesting ways of improving employer-employee relationships in the best interests of both. In addition, the Committee shall examine the programs and priorities of the various public agencies which directly serve migrant workers or otherwise have a substantial impact on their lives and recommend ways in which these services could be improved. To accomplish these objectives, the Committee is directed to:
  - A. Obtain information needed to define the scope of the problems to be considered and to determine the best possible methods of resolving them.
  - B. Hold regular public meetings for the purpose of identifying and thoroughly discussing specific problems and suggestions for dealing with them.

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
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C. Propose courses of action which would improve the quality of life for migrant workers in Wisconsin. To this end, the Committee shall report to the Governor on an annual basis. Such reports will include an accounting of the Committee's activities during the year, a summary of matters considered and an evaluation of public programs and policies which affect migrant workers. The report should also include a series of recommendations as to specific actions which the state might take to resolve problems faced by migrant workers and their employers.

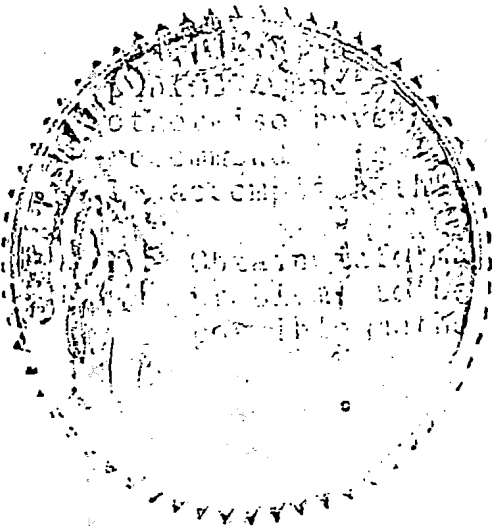
II. The Technical-Advisory Committee shall function as a resource body for the purpose of providing information to the Governor's Committee on Migratory Labor.

Members of the Technical-Advisory Committee are expected to attend all Committee meetings, in a non-voting capacity, and to contribute substantially to the Committee's deliberations, both by informing the Committee as to actions taken by the agencies they represent and by assessing ways in which services might be improved. The Technical-Advisory Committee will also make available statistics and other materials which will assist the Committee in making factual determinations with regard to matters under consideration.
