EXECUTIVE ORDER # 85

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Staff Sergeant Todd Olson of the Wisconsin Army National Guard Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

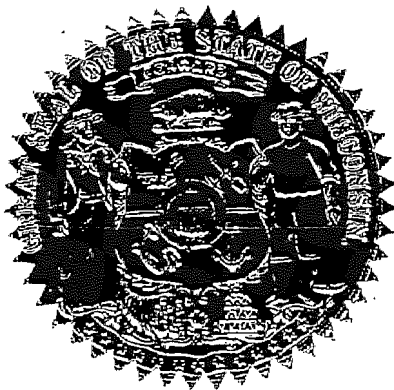
WHEREAS, on December 27, 2004, Staff Sergeant Todd Olson, a member of Company C, 1st Battalion, 128th Infantry, Wisconsin Army National Guard, died as a result of wounds received during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Todd Olson provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Staff Sergeant Todd Olson; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held for Staff Sergeant Todd Olson on Wednesday, January 5, 2005;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on Wednesday, January 5, 2005, and ending at sunset on that date.
