EXECUTIVE ORDER #194

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin May Be Flown at Half-Staff in Iowa County as a Mark of Respect for Chief Judge William D. Dyke of the Iowa County Circuit Court

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2016, Chief Judge William D. Dyke of the Iowa County Circuit Court passed away at the age of 85; and

WHEREAS, Chief Judge William D. Dyke had served the people of Iowa County as a circuit court judge for nearly twenty years; and

WHEREAS, Chief Judge William D. Dyke had been selected by the Wisconsin Supreme Court as the head of Wisconsin's 7th Judicial District, an administrative district encompassing twelve counties; and

WHEREAS, Chief Judge William D. Dyke had previously served as Mayor of the City of Madison from 1969 through 1973; and

WHEREAS, Chief Judge William D. Dyke was a dedicated public servant, and the people of Wisconsin mourn his passing; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held for Chief Judge William D. Dyke in Iowa County on Saturday, April 2, 2016;

NOW THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby authorize that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin may be flown at half-staff throughout Iowa County, beginning at sunrise on **Saturday, April 2, 2016**, and ending at sunset on that date.
