EXECUTIVE ORDER #210

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Army Corporal Donald L. DuPont Who Lost His Life in the Korean War

WHEREAS, United States Army Corporal Donald L. “Donny” DuPont of Alma Center, Wisconsin, a member of B Company, 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division, was reported missing in action on December 2, 1950, during a battle near the Chosin Reservoir in North Korea;

WHEREAS, on January 24, 2023, the remains of Corporal DuPont were identified after North Korea turned over 55 boxes purported to contain the remains of American service members killed during the Korean War;

WHEREAS, a rosette will be placed next to Corporal DuPont’s name on the American Battle Monuments Commission’s Courts of the Missing at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific in Honolulu, Hawaii, to indicate that he has now been accounted for;

WHEREAS, the people of the United States and the state of Wisconsin are eternally grateful for the service, selflessness, and sacrifice of Corporal DuPont; and

WHEREAS, Corporal DuPont will be buried on August 23, 2023, in Fairchild, Wisconsin.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State, hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin, beginning at sunrise on Wednesday, August 23, 2023, and ending at sunset on that date.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this twenty-first day of August in the year of two thousand twenty-three.
