



## 2007 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 108

February 26, 2008 – Introduced by Representative BIES, cosponsored by Senator A. LASEE. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1       **Relating to:** the life and military service of Sergeant Louis Griese of the United  
2               States Army, who lost his life during Operation Enduring Freedom.

3               Whereas, on October 31, 2007, Sergeant Louis Griese, of Sturgeon Bay,  
4       Wisconsin, a member of the 2nd Battalion, 327th Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade  
5       Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division, died while serving his country in Tikrit, Iraq;  
6       and

7               Whereas, Sergeant Griese provided faithful and honorable service to the people  
8       of the state of Wisconsin and to the people of the United States of America; and

9               Whereas, Sergeant Griese is a 1996 graduate of Sturgeon Bay High School. He  
10       was described as a quiet student and never got into trouble; his mother said he might  
11       have been “the perfect teenager.” Griese was fond of the Halloween holiday and it  
12       should come as no surprise that he enjoyed the “Halloween” movie series. His  
13       mechanical side had him fixing cars and installing stereo equipment; and

14               Whereas, Sergeant Griese earned many prestigious military awards, including  
15       the Army Achievement Medal with Silver Oak Leaf Cluster, the Army Good Conduct

1 Medal with Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster, the National Defense Service Medal, the Iraq  
2 Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, the Global War  
3 on Terrorism Service Medal, the Noncommissioned Officer Professional  
4 Development Ribbon, the Army Service Ribbon, and the Overseas Service Ribbon;  
5 and

6 Whereas, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Sergeant Griese, a native  
7 of Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin; and

8 Whereas, Sergeant Griese is survived by his wife, Stephanie and their  
9 daughter, Skylar of Fort Campbell, Kentucky; his parents, Sue and Jim Frihart of  
10 Sturgeon Bay; his sister, Samantha (Tony) Avery and her children, Bradley and  
11 Helen Stacie of Green Bay; one step niece, Christina Cheek; step great-nephew  
12 Charles Avery; four half brothers, Bruce Griese of Beaver Falls, Pennsylvania, Keith  
13 Griese of Green Bay, Dale Griese of Villa Rice, Georgia, and Brandon Griese of Green  
14 Bay; four half sisters, Wendy Eslinger of Corvallis, Montana, Cindy Orada of  
15 Algoma, Dove Griese of Kewaunee; and Melody Lacey of Kewaunee; a sister-in-law,  
16 Sandi (Staff Sergeant Steven Takesly, also serving in Iraq); a brother-in-law, Mark  
17 (Cheryl) Tate of Wolfforth, Texas; and his in-laws, Charles and Glenda Tate; and

18 Whereas, Sergeant Griese was preceded in death by his father, John Griese, his  
19 grandparents, Philip and Helen Albertson and Harold and John Mabel (Younk)  
20 Griese; and step grandfather, Floyd Jacobs; and

21 Whereas, Sergeant Griese was laid to rest on Saturday, November 10, 2007, at  
22 Evergreen Cemetery in Algoma, Wisconsin; now, therefore, be it

23 ***Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That*** legislature of the  
24 state of Wisconsin commemorates the remarkable life of Sergeant Louis Griese and  
25 extends its deepest sympathies to his family, friends and colleagues; and be it further

1           **Resolved, That** the assembly chief clerk shall transmit a copy of this joint
