



## 2009 ASSEMBLY BILL 935

April 6, 2010 - Introduced by Representatives M. WILLIAMS, SUDER, MURSAU, KLEEFISCH, LEMAHIEU, GUNDERSON and TOWNSEND, cosponsored by Senator DARLING. Referred to Committee on Corrections and the Courts.

1     **AN ACT to amend** 301.45 (2) (a) 5., 301.45 (7) (a), 301.46 (2) (b) 5. and 301.46 (5)  
2           (bm) 3. of the statutes; **relating to:** information on a person who is required to  
3           register as a sex offender.

### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Under current law, a person must register with the Department of Corrections (DOC) as a sex offender if he or she has been convicted of certain sex offenses, found not guilty of certain sex offenses by reason of mental disease or defect, or adjudicated delinquent on the basis of certain sex offenses. DOC must provide the general public with Internet access to certain information on the registry, such as a registrant's name, physical description, address, and crime that led to the requirement to register. This bill requires the registry to include, and make available to the general public, all addresses at which a registrant will reside. In addition, the general public Internet site must indicate all addresses for each entry in the sex offender register, whether the entry is a registrant's name or an alias a registrant uses.
