



2009 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 112

February 26, 2010 – Introduced by Representatives PARISI, BLACK, BIES, ROYS, PASCH, POCAN, POPE-ROBERTS, TURNER and GRIGSBY, cosponsored by Senators MILLER, DARLING, KANAVAS, KAPANKE, TAYLOR, ELLIS and CARPENTER. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1 **Relating to:** declaring March 10, 2010, Tibet Day.

2 Whereas, Tibetans around the world are holding events to commemorate 51
3 years of exile and celebrate the efforts to preserve and sustain their identity and to
4 thank governments, including the United States for its support during this time; and

5 Whereas, the United States Congress has enacted legislation declaring Tibet
6 an occupied country whose true representatives are His Holiness the Dalai Lama
7 and the Tibetan Government in Exile; and

8 Whereas, the accumulated grievances of almost six decades of cultural,
9 religious, economic, and linguistic repression of the Tibetan people by the
10 government of the People's Republic of China has resulted in resentments that are
11 the root of the Tibetan protests; and

12 Whereas, the human rights and freedom in Tibet must be the concern of all
13 freedom-loving people who must call on the government of China to end its
14 crackdown on Tibet and enter into a substantive dialogue with His Holiness the
