



1997 ASSEMBLY BILL 434

June 24, 1997 - Introduced by Representatives BLACK, J. LEHMAN, WASSERMAN, ROBSON, MURAT, SYKORA, CULLEN and PLOUFF, cosponsored by Senators JAUCH and GROBSCHMIDT. Referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

1 **AN ACT to create** 121.91 (4) (f) of the statutes; **relating to:** increasing a school
2 district's revenue limit by the amount spent for school security measures.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law limits the increase in the total amount of revenue that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes in a school year to \$206 per pupil. Several exceptions are provided. For example, if a school district increases the services that it provides by adding responsibility for providing a service transferred to it from another governmental unit, its revenue limit is increased by the cost of that service.

This bill provides that a school district's revenue limit is increased by an amount equal to the amount spent by the school district for measures designed to prevent criminal activity in schools.

3 **SECTION 1.** 121.91 (4) (f) of the statutes is created to read:

1 the school district in that school year for security measures designed to prevent
2 criminal activity in schools, as determined by the state superintendent.

3 **SECTION 2. Initial applicability.**

4 (1) This act first applies to the calculation of a school district's revenue limit
5 for the school year beginning after the effective date of this subsection.
