



1997 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 67

August 28, 1997 – Introduced by Representatives UNDERHEIM, SCHAFER, ZUKOWSKI, OTTE, GROTHMAN, GUNDERSON, ALBERS, SERATTI, GOETSCH, F. LASEE and NASS, cosponsored by Senators DRZEWIECKI and FARROW. Referred to Committee on State–Federal Relations.

1 **Relating to:** memorializing Congress to cease certain activities concerning the
2 United Nations, and directing distribution.

3 Whereas, President Clinton has affirmed that his foreign policy regarding the
4 deployment of U.S. military forces under the authority of the United Nations will
5 bear little change from that of his predecessor; and

6 Whereas, the constitutional role of the U.S. military is to protect the life, liberty
7 and property of United States citizens and to defend our nation against insurrection
8 or foreign invasion; and

9 Whereas, the United States is an independent, sovereign nation and not a
10 tributary of the United Nations; and

11 Whereas, there is no popular support for the establishment of a “new world
12 order” or world sovereignty of any kind either under the United Nations or under any
13 world body in any form of global government; and

14 Whereas, global government would mean the destruction of our Constitution
15 and corruption of the spirit of the Declaration of Independence, our freedom and our
16 way of life; now, therefore, be it
