



2005 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 45

June 23, 2005 – Introduced by Representative SCHNEIDER. Referred to Committee on Campaigns and Elections.

1 **To renumber** joint rule chapter 11; and **to create** joint rule chapter 11; **relating to:**
2 prohibitions on fund-raising social events and related campaign contributions
3 by the legislative leaders and members of the legislature before the date of
4 enactment of the executive budget bill.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Joint Rule 94: This joint rule is created to prohibit fund-raising social events and related campaign contributions by legislative leaders and members of the legislature before the date of enactment of the executive budget bill.

5 **Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That:**
6 **SECTION 1.** Joint rule chapter 11 is renumbered joint rule chapter 12.
7 **SECTION 2.** Joint rule chapter 11 is created to read:
8 **Chapter 11:**
9 **CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS**
10 **JOINT RULE 94. Campaign contributions.** (1) In this rule:

1 (a) “Contribution,” “legislative campaign committee,” and “personal campaign
2 committee” have the meanings given for the terms in section 11.01 of the statutes.

3 (b) “Legislative leader” means a member of the senate or assembly committee
4 on organization or the joint committee on finance.

5 (2) A legislative leader or member may not schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit,
6 make, or receive, a contribution for or at; or authorize a legislative campaign
7 committee to schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a contribution for
8 or at; and a legislative leader or member may not schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit,
9 make, or receive, a contribution for or at; or authorize his or her personal campaign
10 committee to schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a contribution for
11 or at; a fund-raising social event or otherwise after January 1 of the odd-numbered
12 year and before the date of enactment, as defined in section 35.095 (1) (a) of the
13 statutes, of the executive budget bill introduced under section 16.47 (1) of the
14 statutes.

15 (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a legislative
16 campaign committee held during the period between the first day authorized for
17 filing nomination papers for any special election to the senate or assembly and the
18 date of the special election.

19 (4) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current
20 member of the senate or assembly or his or her personal campaign committee held
21 during the period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for
22 any office for which a current member of the senate or assembly is a candidate and
23 the date of the election for that office, if the event is held within the boundaries of
24 the jurisdiction or district served by the office for which the current member of the
25 senate or assembly is a candidate.

1 (5) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current
2 member of the senate or assembly or his or her personal campaign committee held
3 during the period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for
4 any office, other than senator, in the case of a member of the senate, or other than
5 representative to the assembly, in the case of a member of the assembly, for which
6 a current member of the senate or assembly is a candidate and the date of the election
7 for that other office.
