



## 2009 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 81

April 22, 2010 - Introduced by Senators GROTHMAN, DARLING and LAZICH, cosponsored by Representative LEMAHIEU. Referred to Committee on Small Business, Emergency Preparedness, Technical Colleges, and Consumer Protection.

1     **Relating to:** a civilian national security force.

2             Whereas, then senator Barack Obama stated on July 2, 2008, that “We cannot  
3 continue to rely on our military in order to achieve our national security objectives  
4 that we’ve set. We’ve got to have a civilian national security force that’s just as  
5 powerful, just as strong, and just as well funded [as our military]”; and

6             Whereas, while it may not be unusual for a socialistic, atheistic totalitarian  
7 regime to form a huge national security force to create dependency and monitor the  
8 citizenry, our country was not founded to be such a state; and

9             Whereas, as any American schoolchild should know, a civilian security force as  
10 well funded as our military would be disallowed under the Ninth and Tenth  
11 Amendments; and

12             Whereas, while no specific national security force has yet been proposed, other  
13 Obama initiatives including a national database of school records from preschool to  
14 graduate school, a national database of medical records, federal ownership of car  
15 companies and banks, and sundry other unconstitutional expansions of federal

1 power show the current chief executive has no respect for the limitations our  
2 forefathers put on our government; now, therefore, be it

3 ***Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That*** the Wisconsin state  
4 legislature expresses its intent to pass a law barring any federal employee of a new  
5 national security force to enforce laws which should be the purview of state and local  
6 law enforcement under our Constitution should such a national security force be  
7 established.
