



2023 ASSEMBLY BILL 593

October 31, 2023 – Introduced by Representatives SHELTON, SNODGRASS, PALMERI, J. ANDERSON, ANDRACA, BALDEH, CONSIDINE, EMERSON, HONG, JACOBSON, JOERS, MOORE OMOKUNDE, ORTIZ-VELEZ, RATCLIFF, SINICKI, STUBBS, SUBECK, HAYWOOD and CLANCY, cosponsored by Senators SMITH, HESSELBEIN, L. JOHNSON, LARSON, ROYS, SPREITZER and AGARD. Referred to Committee on Campaigns and Elections.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 6.20 and 6.36 (2) (a); and **to create** 6.31 and 6.36 (2) (d) of the
2 statutes; **relating to:** voter preregistration of 16-year-olds and 17-year-olds.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, only qualified electors may register to vote and vote in an election. A qualified elector is a U.S. citizen age 18 or older who has resided in an election district or ward for 28 consecutive days.

Under this bill, an individual who is age 16 or 17 but who is otherwise eligible to vote in Wisconsin may preregister to vote. An individual who preregisters under the bill may not vote in an election unless he or she is at least 18 years of age on election day.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 6.20 of the statutes is amended to read:
4 **6.20 Absent electors.** Any qualified elector of this state who registers, and
5 any individual who preregisters under s. 6.31 and will be at least 18 years of age on
6 election day, may vote by absentee ballot under ss. 6.84 to 6.89.

1 **SECTION 2.** 6.31 of the statutes is created to read:

2 **6.31 Preregistration.** An individual who is an eligible elector under s. 6.02,
3 except that he or she is age 16 or 17, may preregister to vote by any registration
4 method provided in s. 6.30.

5 **SECTION 3.** 6.36 (2) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

6 6.36 (2) (a) Except as provided in ~~par.~~ pars. (b) and (d), each registration list
7 prepared for use as a poll list at a polling place or for purposes of canvassing absentee
8 ballots at an election shall contain the full name and address of each registered
9 elector; a blank column for the entry of the serial number of the electors when they
10 vote or the poll list number used by the municipal board of absentee ballot canvassers
11 in canvassing absentee ballots; an indication next to the name of each elector for
12 whom proof of residence under s. 6.34 is required; a space for entry of the type of and
13 the name of the entity or institution that issued the identifying document submitted
14 by the elector as proof of residence when proof of residence under s. 6.34 is required;
15 a space for entry of the elector's signature, or if another person signed the elector's
16 registration form for the elector by reason of the elector's physical disability, the word
17 "exempt"; and a form of certificate bearing the certification of the commission
18 administrator stating that the list is a true and complete registration list of the
19 municipality or the ward or wards for which the list is prepared. The commission
20 shall, by rule, prescribe the space and location for entry of each elector's signature
21 on the poll list which shall provide for entry of the signature without changing the
22 orientation of the poll list from the orientation used by the election officials.

23 **SECTION 4.** 6.36 (2) (d) of the statutes is created to read:
