### CHAPTER 3

AN ACT to create paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1), section 20.21, relating to appropriation to the state superintendent of public instruction.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There are added to subsection (1) of section 20.21 two paragraphs to read: (20.21) (1) (a) To the state superintendent an annual salary of five thousand dollars.

(b) Not to exceed two hundred and fifty dollars to carry out the provisions of subsection (8) of section 14.57.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of July 1, 1919.

### CHAPTER 4

AN ACT to create section 943k of the statutes, relating to validating bonds proposed to be issued under section 942 of the statutes.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: Section 943k. Whenever any village organized under the laws of this state shall have within its boundaries the same territory as that which constitutes a school district and whenever said school district shall have issued its bonds for school purposes up to the extent of its constitutional limitation and whenever said village shall have determined to issue its village bonds under section 942 of the statutes for the construction of school buildings and whenever said question shall have been submitted to the qualified electors of said village at a special election duly called and duly held as provided by law and whenever a majority of the qualified electors of any village shall have voted in favor of the issuing of such bonds for said purpose, such bonds shall be and they are hereby declared to be in all respects valid, legal and binding upon such village, provided said bonds are issued within three years following the date of such election.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
