

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund to the committee created by chapter 393 of the laws of 1927 the sum of five thousand dollars for the preparation of exhibits, the publication of advertising literature, railroad transportation charges and other necessary expenses to suitably advertise the industrial, agricultural and recreational advantages of Wisconsin through Wisconsin's official special train on its tour to southern states, but no part of this appropriation shall be used to pay the expenses of any person on the train, provided that this shall not be construed to prevent payment of a quartet or other entertainers taken along to advertise Wisconsin. Payments hereunder shall be made upon vouchers approved by the chairman and secretary of the committee.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 3.

AN ACT to create paragraph (h) of subsection (14) of section 20.17 of the statutes, relating to a new location for the industrial school for girls and making an appropriation.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new paragraph is added to subsection (14) of section 20.17 of the statutes to read: (20.17) (14) (New (15)) (h). On February 1, 1928, two hundred thousand dollars and on July 1, 1928, two hundred thousand dollars to purchase a site for and to construct and equip the necessary buildings for the Wisconsin industrial school for girls at a new location to be selected by the state board of control, subject to the approval of the governor.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
