An Act to appropriate to the County of Waukesha the sum therein named.

Chap. 130

*The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the county of Waukesha, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five hundred and sixty-four dollars and fifty-one cents, in full pay and satisfaction for maintainance and support of state prisoners up to January 1st, 1851, including medicines, medical attendance, clothing, and all other items chargeable therefor.

An Act to divide the county of Crawford and organise the counties of Bad Ax and La Crosse.

Chap. 131

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. All that portion of the county of Crawford lying between sections nineteen, twenty, twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three and twenty-four, in townships eleven and townships fifteen, north, of ranges two, three, four, five, six and seven west, be and hereby is organised into a separate county, to be known and called by the name of Bad Ax; and all that portion of Crawford county lying north of townships number fourteen north, of ranges two, three, four, five, six and seven, be and hereby is organised into a separate county to be known and called by the name of La Crosse.

Division and boundaries.

SUC. 2. On the first Tuesday in the month of April next the electors of said counties of Bad Ax and La Crosse shall in addition to electing their town officers vote for and elect all officers necessary for a complete county organisation, and the
