Chap. 135

An Act authorizing the sale of the unsold odd numbered Sections of Milwaukee and Rock River Canal Grant, for the use of Schools.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the Commissioners for the sale of the School and University lands, to sell at private entry, all the unsold odd numbered Sections of the Milwaukee and Rock River Canal Grant, at their appraised value, for the use of Schools.

SEC. 2. The purchasers and occupants of said lands shall be subject to all the liabilities and benefits, as provided by law for the pre-emption and sale of the other School lands.

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.

Chap. 136

An Act supplementary to "An Act to authorize the assessment and collection of taxes in the city of Milwaukee" approved January 24th, 1851.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The special tax or taxes mentioned in section four (4) of the act to which this is supplementary shall not be construed to mean and include any tax or assessments levied upon lots or pieces of land for building and constructing any docks or wharfs or for opening, widening, grading, gravelling, filling or making any streets, alleys, lanes or sidewalks, or for abating any nuisance in any of the wards of said city where

there is now in force any general or special provision by law or ordinance relating to any such docks or wharfs, streets, alleys, lanes, sidewalks or nuisances: But the taxes for such purposes in such cases shall be levied by the Aldermen of the respective wards, in which such improvements shall be made or nuisance abated in accordance with such laws or ordinances as are in force relating thereto.

SEC. 2. Said taxes shall be levied by the Aldermen aforesaid and a return thereof shall be made under their hands at such time as the Common Council may prescribe to the Clerk of said city who shall file the same in his office, and the several amounts of taxes in said return contained shall be carried into the general tax list and set opposite to the respective lots upon which the same may be levied or assessed in a separate column for that purpose and the said tax or assessment so made out shall be regarded for all purposes of collection as a general tax, and shall create a like lien upon the lots and pieces of land upon which the same may be levied and assessed as aforesaid.

SEC. 3. In case of the non-payment of said tax together with such other taxes as may be levied upon said lots and pieces of land at the time limited for the payment of the general tax of said city the same shall be sold pursuant to the provisions of section ten (10) of the act to which this is supplementary; and the said lots or pieces of land upon which the said tax or taxes may be levied or assessed shall be subject to all the provisions, limitations, restrictions and liabilities in said section ten (10) contained or to which it refers, and for the purposes of enforcing collection of said tax by sale for non-payment thereof the same shall be deemed a general tax.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of State immediately upon the passage of this act to cause the same to be published by the Public Printer in a newspaper published at Madison, and the same shall be in force from and after such publication.
