

## Chap. 202

An Act to authorise the laying out of a State road therein named.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

Commissioners appointed to lay out a road  
Direction thereof

SECTION 1. That R. Walsh, William Wightman and George Ramsey are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a State road from the village of West Bend in the county of Washington, to the village of Sheboygan Falls in the county of Sheboygan.

Supervisors to make compensation.

SEC. 2. The commissioners shall be entitled to such compensation for their services from the counties through which the road passes, as the board of Supervisors shall deem just. Provided, that no part of the expenses of laying out said road shall be paid out of the State treasury.

## Chap. 203

An Act to authorise Ebenezer Dakin to build a dam across White river.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

Dam—who to construct—and height.

SECTION 1. That Ebenezer Dakin, his heirs and assigns, shall have power to build and construct a dam, to the height of twelve feet, across the White river, in the county of Marquette, on or near section seventeen, town seventeen, range eleven, for hydraulic purposes.

Channel of river—how improved.

SEC. 2. That said Ebenezer Dakin shall be further empowered, at his own cost to alter, enlarge and improve the channel of said river, from the point selected for the location of said dam, to its junction with Fox river, for the purpose of the free navigation of said White river.

## Chap. 204

An act to authorise the laying out of a State Road therein named.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. That William Bach of Manitowoc, Solomon

Lombard of Greenbush, and William R. Longstreet are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a State Road from the village of Manitowoc, through the villages of Greenbush and Mayville, to Madison. Commissioners appointed to lay out road—route

SEC. 2. Said commissioners shall be allowed to employ such surveyors and other assistants for the survey of said road, as they may deem necessary. Commissioners may employ Surveyors, &c.

SEC. 3. Said commissioners, surveyors and other assistants shall be entitled to such compensation for their services, from the counties through which said road passes, as the Supervisors of said counties shall deem just and reasonable: Provided, That no part of the expenses of laying out said road, shall be paid out of the State Treasury. County Supervisors to provide compensation. Proviso.

An Act authorizing the State Treasurer to pay to the Town Superintendents of Common Schools in the County of Jefferson, monies to which they are entitled by law. Chap. 205

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The Treasurer of the State is hereby authorized and required to pay over, upon the orders of the town Superintendents of the several towns in the county of Jefferson, the amount of school money apportioned by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, to each such town respectively: such order to be countersigned by the Town Clerk of the proper town, and directed to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. State Treasurer to pay to the order of Town Superintendents.

SEC. 2. Such orders so drawn as above, shall first be presented to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, and shall be by him endorsed, indicating thereon the amount of money apportioned to such towns, and such order so drawn and countersigned shall be sufficient vouchers for the payment of the amount of money called for thereby in the hands of the Treasurer in his settlement with the Treasurer of the county of Jefferson for such fund, so far as the same shall be paid upon such orders. State Superintendent to endorse orders prior to payment.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and shall be and continue in force only so long as shall be necessary to close up account of school money in the hands of the Treasurer belonging to said county of Jefferson. Duration of act.
