SEC. 5. That an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Upper Wisconsin Navigation Improvement Company," approved February ninth, eighteen hundred and fifty is hereby repealed. Repealed.

An Act to authorize Henry J Elliot and his associates to build and maintain a bridge across Fox river at Delhi, in the county of Winnebago. **Chap. 326**

*The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. That Henry J. Elliot, his associates and assigns, shall have power to build and maintain a bridge across Fox river, on any land owned by them, at Delhi, on section twenty-three, in town eighteen of range fourteen, at the foot of Harriet street, in the village of Delhi. Who may build bridge.

SEC. 2. Said bridge shall not be less than twelve feet wide, and shall be constructed with a draw over the channel of the river, not less than fifty feet wide, which shall be opened at all times for the passage of boats, rafts, or other craft, free of charge, and without unnecessary delay. Draw to be free.

SEC. 3. Said bridge shall be commenced within one year, and completed within three years. Time of construction.

SEC. 4. The legislature may at any time amend or repeal this act. Reservation.

SEC. 5. The said grantees shall, after the completion of said bridge, have power to demand and collect tolls for passing over the same, as follows : for any vehicle drawn by one horse, ten cents ; for any vehicle drawn by two horses or oxen, twenty cents ; and for each additional horse, five cents ; for foot passengers, three cents ; for all animals in droves, three cents each : Provided, that hogs and sheep shall not be charged more than at the rate of two cents per head. Rates of toll.

SEC. 6. There shall be kept posted up, in some conspicuous place on said bridge, the rates of toll allowed by this act. Rates to be posted up.

SEC. 7. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

**Chap. 327** An Act supplementary to an Act entitled "An Act to authorise the assessment and collection of taxes in the city of Milwaukee," approved January 24th, 1851.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :*

Council may  
extend time for  
collecting taxes

SECTION 1. The Common Council of the city of Milwaukee shall have power to extend the time for the collection of the taxes and the tax sale authorised by "An Act to authorise the assessment and collection of taxes in the city of Milwaukee," approved January 24, 1851 ; said extension of time not to exceed two weeks.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of State to cause this act to be published by the public printer, immediately after its passage, and the same shall be in force from and after its publication.

**Chap. 328** An Act for the relief of those persons commonly called Seventh Day Baptists, and others who keep the seventh day of the week as a day of rest.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

Provide for con-  
tinuance of  
cause on certain  
conditions

SECTION 1. Whenever civil process shall be issued by any Justice of the Peace against any person who habitually observes and keeps the seventh day of the week instead of the first as a day of rest, and such process shall be made returnable on the seventh day of the week, known as Saturday, such defendant shall be entitled to have the cause continued to the (Monday) following Monday, [at the] same time by filing with such Justice, one day before the return of the writ, an affidavit in writing stating that he or she (as the case may be), habitually keeps and observes the seventh day of the week instead of the first as a day of rest; and such defendant shall be entitled to all his rights, on such adjournment day of the same, as if it were the
