

Chap 169

An Act to change the name of the village of Adams in Sauk County.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The name of the village of Adams in the county of Sauk in this state, is hereby changed to Baraboo, by which name the said village shall hereafter be known and designated, and all writs, processes, pleadings, and proceedings, dated at, or necessary to be made returnable at the village of Adams, shall be taken to be dated at, or returnable to the village of Baraboo, and shall have the same effect in law as if no change had been made in the name of said village.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chap 170

An Act to discharge the sureties upon the official bond of Edward H. Janssen, State Treasurer.
