An Act to Organize the County of Oconto, for county purposes.

Chap 234

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That the county of Oconto shall be organized from and after the tenth day of June next, for the purposes of county government, and shall enjoy all the rights, privileges, immunities and powers of the other counties in this state. County organized.

SEC. 2. Said county of Oconto shall be and is hereby (after the tenth day of June next) organized into one town, and shall be called the town of Oconto; and the first election shall be held at the house of David Jones, at the county seat of said county. Organized into a town.

SEC. 3. There shall be an election held in said county and town of Oconto, at the house of David Jones aforesaid, on Thursday, the tenth day of June next, for the election of all such town and county officers as the said county, by virtue of its organization, and the privileges of this act shall be entitled to; which said county officers shall severally hold their office until the first day of January next, and their successors are duly elected and qualified; and said town officers shall severally hold their offices until the next annual town meeting, and until their successors are duly elected and qualified. Where election to be held

SEC. 4. The said election shall be conducted in all respects in the manner now provided for holding the same, under the law regulating general elections, and the votes cast at the same shall be returned and canvassed as therein provided; and the judges of said election shall issue certificates of election to any person duly elected under the provisions of this act. How election to be held

SEC. 5. Said county so organized, shall remain attached to the county of Brown for judicial purposes, until otherwise provided by law.

SEC. 6. The town supervisors so elected on said day of County board

election, shall constitute the county board of supervisors, and shall meet on the first Monday of July, at the seat of justice of said county, together with the clerk of said county, all of whom being first duly qualified according to law, shall then and there proceed to perform all such duties as may be required of them by law.

Costs to be paid to Brown county SEC. 7. The county of Oconto shall pay into the treasury of said county of Brown all costs and expenses that shall be paid by the said county of Brown, which have or may accrue in consequence of any proceeding whatever against any person charged with any crime or misdemeanor within said county of Oconto.

An Act in relation to the construction of an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Milwaukee and the several acts amendatory thereof" approved February 24, 1852, and to confer certain powers on the common council of the city of Milwaukee.

Chap 235

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

How act construed. SECTION 1. Section eighteen of chapter ten of "An Act to consolidate and amend the act to incorporate the city of Milwaukee and the several acts amendatory thereof," approved February twenty, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, shall not be construed so as to prevent the street commissioners of the several wards of the said city from ordering and causing to be done the grading of any street within their ward to a temporary grade to be established by such street commissioners.

May issue bonds SEC. 2. The common council of said city is hereby authorized to issue bonds of the city, bearing interest of not more than ten per centum, as the common council may determine, to pay the debt of the said city, and the several wards thereof.

To elect representative to M. & M. R. R. Co. SEC. 3. The said common council shall have authority to elect annually one or more persons to cast, at the election of the directors of the Milwaukee and Mississippi Railroad Company, the number of votes to which the city of Milwaukee is entitled by the number of shares of stock of said company which the said city may hold now or hereafter.
