

## Chap. 77.

AN ACT to provide for the contingent expenses of the  
Bank Comptroller's office.

Published, April 29, 1854.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in  
Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

§ 1. The bank comptroller is hereby authorized to procure a suitable iron safe for the use of his office, and his account for the same shall be audited by the secretary of state and paid out of the state treasury, and the sum of money necessary to pay said account when audited is hereby appropriated to be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated. Authorized to procure a safe.

§ 2. The bank comptroller is hereby authorized to procure suitable books, blanks, and forms for the use of his office, and especially to procure the books necessary to carry into effect the thirty-ninth section of the banking law of this state, and the expenses attending the same, as well as writing up the said books to the present time, in the manner recommended by the committee on banks and banking of the senate, shall be paid out of the tax paid into the state treasury by the banks; all of the said accounts, as well as the postage account of the bank comptroller's office, to be audited by the secretary of state and paid by the state treasurer out of the said fund, and the sum of money necessary to pay said account when audited, is hereby appropriated to be paid out of any money in the treasury of said fund, not otherwise appropriated. To procure blank books.

§ 3. The bank comptroller is hereby required to annually report to the legislature the transactions of his office during the preceding year. Annual report.

§ 4. The bank comptroller shall hereafter keep his office in the room in the basement of the capitol, now occupied by the state agricultural society, and the governor shall cause the same to be suitably fitted up for the accommodation of said office. Office to be in basement of capitol.
