

## Chapter 73.

An Act to fix the time for holding the terms of the circuit court in the counties of Brown and Outagamie.

*The People of the state of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :*

Time of holding court changed.

SECTION 1. The terms of the circuit court for the counties of Brown, and Outagamie, from and after the first Monday of July, A. D. eighteen hundred and fifty-five, shall be holden at the times following to wit: In the county of Outagamie on the third Monday in April and the third Monday in October in each year. In the county of Brown on the third Monday in September, and the second Monday in January and the fourth Monday in April, in each year: *Provided*, That at the January term of said court, in each year, a petit jury only shall be summoned to attend said court, and all recognizances on criminal charges entered into before a justice of the peace shall be deemed and held to be returnable at the nex term thereafter at which a grand jury shall be summoned without regard to the said jury term.

Proviso.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the judge of the tenth judicial circuit, to hold, in the county of Outagamie, on the first Monday in January in each year, a special term of the circuit court, for the purpose of hearing and disposing of all motions and questions of law; and all judgments, orders and decrees that may be made or entered at said special terms shall be as valid and effectual to all intents and purposes, as any judgments, orders or decrees made or entered in term time.
