

any of the duties of their respective offices required of them by law, of one dollar and fifty cents for each day, and at the same rate for parts of a day; and no town officer shall be entitled to pay for acting in more than one official capacity of office at the same time, unless the town shall have fixed a different compensation at the annual town meeting.

SEC. 2. So much of section ninety-three, chapter twelve of the revised statutes, as conflicts with the provisions of this act, is hereby repealed. **Repealed.**

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of April next.

CHAPTER 99.

An Act to authorize the Secretary of State to audit certain accounts.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized and empowered to audit the account of Atwood & Rublee and Calkins & Proudfit, for publishing the report of the proceedings of the supreme court, in the gubernatorial case, ordered by the senate and assembly for their use, in pamphlet form, provided the publishers shall furnish the same at a price not exceeding the rate of ten cents per copy for every thirty-two pages of size and matter corresponding with the annual reports as published by the state printers: and upon the completion of said work draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the amount so audited and allowed. **Secretary of state to audit certain accounts.**

SEC. 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sufficient amount to pay the said warrants of the secretary of state as contemplated in the first and second sections of this act. **Appropriation**

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
