AN ACT to provide for holding the Spring Term of the Circuit Court for the county of Sheboygan.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

§ 1. A term of the Circuit Court of the 4th Judicial Circuit for the county of Sheboygan, may lawfully be held on the second Monday of March A. D. 1857, anything in "an act to change the time of holding courts in the several counties within the 4th Judicial Circuit," approved February 23rd, 1857, to the contrary notwithstanding, but thereafter said court in said circuit, shall be held on the days fixed in said act, approved February 23, 1857.

4th Judicial Circuit Court may be held on Monday, March 2, '57.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to change the names of certain persons therein named.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

§ 1. The name of Wettle Sweningson, of the city of Madison, Dane county, is hereby changed to William Swain, by which name he shall hereafter be known in law, in all courts and places.

§ 2. The name of John Mians, of the town of Dunn, Dane county, is hereby changed to John M. Selden, by which name he shall hereafter be known in law, and for all purposes whatever.

§ 3. The name of Ida Catharine Helm, of the town of Reedsburgh, Sauk county, is hereby changed to that of Ida Catharine Butler, and by the last mentioned name shall be known in all courts and places.

The said Ida Catharine Butler shall be known as the adopted daughter and heir of John Butler, and his wife Susan Butler, of the town of Winfield, in said county of Sauk, and entitled to all the rights and privileges, and subject to all the duties of inheritance, support and maintenance, as fully and effectually, and in the same manner as she might or should be if she were the legitimate child of said John Butler and Susan Butler.

§ 5. The provisions of section four of this act shall not take effect or be in force until the said John Butler and Nancy Helm, mother of said child, shall each irrevocably assent thereto in writing, under their hands and seals, and record the same in the office of the Judge of Probate in and for the county of Sauk.

§ 10. The name of James S. Smith Smith is hereby

changed to James S. Lynden, by which name he shall hereafter be known in all courts and places.

§ 11. The name of Hiram C. Bates, son of Kimball Bates, is hereby changed to George T. West, by which name he shall be hereafter known in all courts and places. Change name of Hiram T. Bates.

§ 12. The name of Jare Stinson, of Kingston, Marquette county, Wisconsin, is hereby changed to Mary Jane Kingsbury, by which name she shall hereafter be known in all courts and places. Change name of Jane Stinson.

§ 13. The said Mary Jane Kingsbury shall hereafter be known as the adopted daughter and heir at law of C. M. Kingsbury and his wife Mary J. Kingsbury, of Kingston, Marquette county, and entitled to all the rights and privileges, and subject to all the duties of inheritance, support and maintenance, as fully and effectually and in the same manner as she might or should be, if she were the legitimate child of said C. M. and Mary J. Kingsbury. Heirship established.

§ 14. The name of Charles Sand, of the city of Milwaukee, is hereby changed to that of Charles Hebenstriet, and by the last mentioned name he shall be hereafter known and recognized for all purposes whatever. Change name of Charles Sand.

§ 15. The said Charles Hebenstriet shall be known as the adopted son and heir of Adam Hebenstret, of said city of Milwaukee, and be entitled to all the rights and privileges and subject to all the duties of inheritance, support and maintenance as fully and effectually, and in the same manner as he might or should be, if he were the legitimate child of the said Adam Hebenstret and Eva Hebenstriet. Heirship established.

§ 16. The name of Sarah Ann Long of the town of Whitewater, in Walworth county, is hereby changed to Sarah Ann Caswell, by which name she shall hereafter be known in all courts and places. Change name of Sarah A. Long.

§ 17. The name of Julius Leithauser, of the town of Hermann, in the county of Sheboygan, is hereby changed to that of Julius Buscher Leithauser, by which name he shall hereafter be known in law, and in all courts and places. Change name of Julius Leithauser.

§ 18. The said Julius Buscher Leithauser shall be known as the adopted son and co-heir of Charles Buscher senior, of said town of Hermann, and of Caroline Buscher, his wife. And the said Julius shall be entitled to all the duties of inheritance, support and main- Heirship established.

tenance under and by the law of this State, in all respects as fully and effectually, and in the same manner as he might or should be, if he were the legitimate child of said Charles Buscher senior, and said Caroline Buscher, his said wife.

**Assent required.** § 19. The provisions of Section eighteen of this act shall not take effect or be in force and applicable to the case therein provided for, until the said Charles Buscher senior, and the said Caroline Buscher, his wife, shall each irrevocably assent thereto in writing under their hands and seals, and record the same in the office of the Judge of Probate in and for the said County of Sheboygan.

§ 20. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

**AN ACT** to provide for payment for the Reports of the Supreme Court, for the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

**Governor to audit account for Supreme Court reports.**

§ 1. The Governor of the State is hereby authorized and required to audit the account of the reporter, for two hundred copies of the Supreme Court reports, for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-five, at the usual publisher's prices, as soon as said copies shall be delivered at the State Library.

§ 2. That the sum so audited and allowed shall be paid out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

§ 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.
