

Chapter 27.

Published March 24th, 1856.

AN ACT to repeal Section 7, of Chapter 99, of the General Laws of 1857, entitled "An Act to change the fiscal year of the State of Wisconsin, and amend an Act relating to Printing," approved April 19, 1852.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Repealed.

SECTION 1. Section 7, of chapter 99, of the general laws of this State, requiring the printer to deliver a certain number of copies of all general laws to each member of the two houses of the legislature, and to each of the State Departments, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chapter 28.

AN ACT providing for the submission of the question to the voters of Calumet County of the division of said County.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Detached from Calumet and attached to Outagamie county.

SECTION 1. All of town number twenty, north of range number eighteen east, lying in the town of Harrison, excepting that portion of the town of Harrison lying east of and including the east tier of sections of said town number twenty, north of range number eighteen east, shall be and the same hereby is detached, and set off from the county of Calumet, and shall thereafter be attached to, and form a part of, the county of Outagamie, and shall form a part of the town of Kaukana, in said county.

To vote on division of county.

SEC. 2. That at the annual town meetings to be held in the several towns in the county of Calumet, on the first Tuesday in April, A. D. 1858, the electors of said

county shall be and are hereby authorized to vote for and against the division of said county.

SEC. 3. The same restrictions and qualifications shall be observed by the people and authorities in conducting the election for the division of the county as are now provided by law for conducting general elections. Election, how conducted.

SEC. 4. The votes cast for or against the division of the county shall be returned and canvassed in the same manner as votes cast at the election for county officers. Votes, how returned and canvassed.

SEC. 5. The votes shall be by ballot and shall have written or printed, or partly written and partly printed on each of them, the words "Division, Yes," or "Division, No." Ballots.

SEC. 6. If a majority of all the legal votes cast at such town meetings upon the question of division shall be in favor of division, then all of town number twenty, north of range number eighteen east, lying in the town of Harrison, excepting that portion of said town of Harrison lying east of and including the east tier of sections of said town number twenty, north of range number eighteen east, shall be stricken from said county of Calumet, and shall thereafter be attached to and form part of the county of Outagamie, and shall form a part of the town of Kaukana, in said county. If majority in favor of division, then to be detached.
 But if a majority of the legal votes cast at such election upon the question of division, be against division, then the boundaries of the county of Calumet shall remain unchanged, and no territory shall be stricken therefrom. If against division, then boundaries to remain unchanged.

SEC. 7. The remaining portion of the town of Harrison shall thereafter be attached to, and form a portion of the town of Woodville, in said county of Calumet.

SEC. 8. This act shall be published by the State printer immediately after its passage; and shall take effect from and after its publication.
