## CHAPTER 232.

[Published April 14, 1860.]

AN ACT to provide for the disposal and expenditure of the drainage fund in the counties of Kewaunee and Door.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

- When interest shall be paid over. SECTION 1. That portion of the interest of the drainage fund which is now, or shall hereafter become due to the counties of Kewaunee and Door, shall be paid over to the county treasurers of said counties, at the same time with the money due to said counties from the school fund for each year.
- Duty of Co. treasurer to apportion. SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the county treasurers of said counties, immediately upon the receipt of the said drainage money, to apportion the same among the several towns of said counties, in proportion to the amount received from the sales of swamp and overflowed lands, in said towns respectively, and he shall immediately give notice, in writing, to the treasurer of each town in said counties, of the amount apportioned to his town.
- Shall give notice to town treasurers. Town treasurers to execute a bond. SEC. 3. Each town treasurer, before receiving the drainage moneys apportioned to the town of which he is treasurer, or any part thereof, shall execute to the chairman of the town board of supervisors of such town, a bond, with two sureties, to be approved by said chairman, by endorsement over his signature on said bond, in a penal sum not less than double the amount of such drainage moneys as shall come into his hands, conditioned for the faithful application and disbursement of all such drainage moneys, in such manner as shall be prescribed by this act, which said bond he shall deliver to the town clerk of said town, to be filed in his office.
- Conditions. SEC. 4. The town clerk of said town, on the receipt thereof, shall file and safely keep such bond in his office, and he shall give to said town treasurer a receipt, stating that he has filed the bond required by the preceding section of this act; which receipt the said treasurer shall
- Bond to be filed. Duty of town clerk. When moneys

deliver to the county treasurer, who shall, on delivery thereof, pay over to the said town treasurer the amount of drainage moneys apportioned to said town. to be paid to town treasurers.

SEC. 5. The town treasurer shall receive, and safely keep in his possession, all such moneys, and shall pay out the same only upon the order of said town board, duly signed by the chairman, and countersigned by the clerk; and the said town treasurer shall receive as a compensation for the performance of the duties devolving upon him under this act, the sum of two per cent. upon all such drainage moneys as shall pass through his hands. Town treasurer shall keep and how pay out such moneys. Compensation

SEC. 6. The said moneys, when so paid into the town treasury, shall be under the control of the town board of supervisors of such town, and shall be expended, under their direction, in the drainage and reclamation of the swamp and overflowed lands in their town, and by the building of roads and bridges, when they shall deem it necessary, over or through the same. The members of the said town board shall be entitled to the sum of one dollar and fifty cents per day, for each and every day actually employed in the performance of the duties enjoined by this act, to be defrayed out of the drainage fund of such town. Moneys to be under control of town board. Compensation of town board

SEC. 7. The town board of each town in said counties, shall, annually, on the second day of the annual meeting of the county board of said counties, make a full and complete report, to said county, of the receipts and disbursements of the said drainage moneys in their respective towns. Town board to make report.

SEC. 8. It shall be the duty of the county board of supervisors to make, to the State Treasurer, a full report of the disbursements of said fund, on or before the first day of December in each year. County board to make report

SEC. 9. For the purpose of draining the swamp lands along the banks of the Ahenpee [Ahnepee] river, in said counties of Kewaunee and Door, the drainage moneys belonging to the towns of Forestville and Ahenpee [Ahnepee,] in said counties, for the year 1860, shall be expended in opening the mouth of said Ahenpee [Ahnepee] river: said moneys to be expended by a commissioner appointed by the town boards of said towns of Forestville and Ahenneepe. [Ahnepee.] Said commissioner to give such bond to the town boards of Forestville and Ahenneepe [Ahnepee] for the faithful performance of his duties, under the provisions of this act, as they shall deem proper. ### CHAPTER 233.

[Published April 3, 1860.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of the county board of supervisors of Manitowoc county, for the year A. D. 1859.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The action of the board of supervisors of the county of Manitowoc, in dividing the town of Two Rivers, and creating the town of Rowley, in said county, at its July session, in the year 1859, is hereby declared to be valid, and of the same force and effect as if all the provisions of law had been complied with by said board, in creating the said town of Rowley.

Vote declared

SEC. 2. The vote taken by the electors of the town of Two Rivers, on the question of division of the said town, at the general election in November, of the year 1859, is hereby declared to be valid, and of the same force and effect as if the question of division had been submitted at the annual town meeting, as required by law.

Voters to  
choose town  
officers.

SEC. 3. The inhabitants of the district of country embraced within the limits of the said town of Rowley shall be entitled to meet for the purpose of choosing town officers, at the time and place designated by the board of supervisors of said county, at their July session, in the year 1859, and the officers then and there chosen, when qualified, shall be the officers of the said town, and shall proceed to organize the same as required by law.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
