

§ 2. At any time after the certificate mentioned in section one of this act, shall be filed as above provided, the said Garrison and Jackson may pay into the State Treasury a sum equal to five dollars per acre, (and at that rate for parts of an acre) contained in said island; such number of acres and parts of an acre to be ascertained from said certificate. Upon such payment being made, the State Treasurer shall execute and deliver to said Garrison and Jackson, a receipt therefor, describing said island as the same shall be described in said certificate, and the title of said island shall, thereupon, vest in said Garrison and Jackson, and the said receipt shall be sufficient evidence of such title in all courts and places.

CHAPTER 286.

AN ACT to vacate certain lots of the town of the Island, in Winnebago county.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All that part of the plat of the "Town of the Island," known and described and recorded as lots 1, 2, 3 and 4, of block "C," and 177, 178, 179, 180, 181, 182, block "B," of town 20, range 17, in the town of Menasha, Winnebago county, Wisconsin, of which Henry Hewitt is the proprietor, is hereby vacated: *Provided*, That the vacation of said plat shall not vacate any street or highway laid out through or over said plat.

Town of the Island—Lots vacated.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
