

- Powers.** and by such name and style shall be competent to contract, and be contracted with, to sue and be sued, to answer and be answered unto, in all courts of law and equity; and shall also be competent, in law, to purchase, have, hold, and enjoy, property both real and personal, and to sell, dispose of, and convey the same; *Provided,*
- Not deal in property.** *however,* that it shall not be lawful for such corporation to deal in property of any kind, except so far as shall be necessary for the legitimate objects of the corporation, as declared in this act: *And provided further,* that the real estate to be held shall not exceed five lots in any city or village, or five acres in the country, not platted into lots.
- Common seal.** SEC. 5. That every such corporation, thus created, may have a common seal, and alter and renew the same at pleasure; and may also adopt a constitution and by-laws for their government, not inconsistent with the laws of this State, or of the United States, and may alter or amend the same at pleasure; and may also designate the number and title of their officers, and may also define their powers and duties.
- Officers, &c.**
- To perfect organization.** SEC. 6. A majority of the corporators named in such certificate, may meet at such time and place as to them shall seem fit and proper, for the purpose of perfecting their organization under the incorporation thus secured; and the said corporators shall constitute the first board of trustees of the society, and shall hold their offices until others are chosen.

CHAPTER 338.

[Published April 27, 1860.]

AN ACT to provide for the laying out of a State road from the village of Kiel, in Manitowoc county, to the town of Calumet, in Fond du Lac county.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Commissioners.

SECTION 1. Mathias Bourgeois, Herman Schlichting, and John Boyd, are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from the village of Kiel, in the county of Manitowoc, to the point where the

Fond du Lac and Green Bay military road intersects the line between sections twenty-three and twenty-six, in township seventeen north of range eighteen east.

SEC. 2. The said commissioners shall receive such Compensation for the time and services actually spent in laying out said road, as may be allowed by the boards of supervisors of the counties through which said road shall be laid, and no part of the expense thereof shall be paid by the State.

SEC. 3. Said road, when so laid out, and the survey Road to be thereof legally recorded, may be opened for public use opened and immediately, and shall not be discontinued or altered by not discontinued the supervisors of any town for two years after the same shall be laid out, and the commissioners above named are hereby authorized to receive subscriptions in money or Receive sub-labor, and apply the same to the opening and working of scriptions. said road.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 339.

[Published April 28, 1860.]

AN ACT to permit the board of supervisors of the several towns in the county of Milwaukee to lay out and open highways of the width [width] of three rods.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The board of supervisors of the several Town boards towns in the county of Milwaukee, are hereby authorized authorized to and empowered, whenever application is made to them, open high-ways. to lay out and open any highway in their respective towns, to cause the same to be laid out and opened, of the width of three rods, whenever, in their judgment, the interests of the public will be thereby subserved.

SEC. 2. Said highways shall be laid out in accordance How laid out. with the provisions of chapter 19, of the Revised Statutes, which chapter is hereby declared to be applicable to them, in all respects, as to the width aforesaid.

SEC. 3. This act shall be printed and take effect immediately after its passage.
