

## CHAPTER 345.

[Published April 28, 1860.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 19, of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of highways and bridges."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Stone, gravel, and sand may be taken in adjoining districts to improve highway.

Consent of overseer.

Damages—how settled.

SECTION 1. Section 14, of chapter 19, of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of highways and bridges," is hereby amended by adding thereto, after the word "highway," where it last occurs in said section, the following words: "and in case there shall be, within the limits of the highway, in any adjoining district, any stone, gravel, or sand, suitable for the improvement of any such highway, the same may be taken and used to improve the highway in such adjoining district: *Provided, however,* that the consent of the overseer of such adjoining district shall be obtained in writing: *And, provided further,* that all damages, if any, to the adjoining land, may be settled as provided in section 15, of the act to which this is amendatory."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 346.

[Published April 28, 1860.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 80, of the acts of a general nature of 1858, being a part of chapter 129, of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of injunctions and writs of *ne exeat*, and of receivers."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Amendment.

SECTION 1. Section one, of chapter eighty, of the acts of a general nature of 1858, is hereby amended, by striking out the words "resident in this State," when it occurs in said section.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
