

## CHAPTER 114.

[Published March 27, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend Chapter 34 of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of the relief and support of the poor."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Superintendents  
subject to county  
boards.

SECTION 1. Chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes, entitled "Of the relief and support of the poor," is hereby amended as follows, to wit: Add to section thirty-five of said chapter thirty-four, the following words: "*provided*, that said superintendents of the poor shall at all times be subject to the direction and control of the county board of supervisors, in all things pertaining to the care and support of the poor; and any one or all of said superintendents shall be liable to be removed from the office of superintendent at any meeting of such board of supervisors, for neglecting or refusing to obey the orders and directions made by said board at its then existing or any of its previous meetings, in relation to any matter connected with the care and support of the poor, or in relation to the disposition of the farm and other property held for such purpose; *and provided, further*, that no one of such superintendents shall be removed from the office of superintendent, without having been first notified of the time when a proposition for such removal will be acted upon by said board."

SECTION 2. Add to section 39 of the chapter referred to in section one of this act, the following words: "And whenever the county board of supervisors of any county where such distinction shall have been theretofore abolished, shall determine to restore the distinction between town and county poor, the office of county superintendent of the poor shall become vacant at such time as shall be determined by such county board of supervisors, and such board shall have full power to determine the manner in which the county poor shall be thereafter supported, and to make any such deposition of the poor house and other property connected therewith belonging to such county, as the said board of supervisors shall deem proper."

Repeal.

SECTION 3. This act shall apply to all the counties

of this state, and so much of any act as conflicts with the provisions of this act, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 116.

[Published April 1, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend Sections 15 and 18 of Chapter 22 of the General Laws of 1859, entitled "An act relative to the sale of land for unpaid taxes, and the conveyance and redemption thereof."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section fifteen of chapter 22 of the general laws of 1859, is hereby amended by inserting between the words "him" and "specifying," in the seventh line thereof, the following words: "Together with a further statement, showing all additional sales of such land or any portion thereof in prior years for unpaid taxes, which remain unredeemed, with the respective dates of all such sales, and with respect to each sale."

Treasurer's statement to show sales of prior years.

SECTION 2. Section eighteen of chapter 22 of the general laws of 1859, is hereby amended by adding to the same the following words: "*and provided, further,* that no one shall be permitted to redeem any lands sold for the non-payment of the taxes of any year, without first redeeming such lands from all prior sales for the unpaid taxes of any previous years, which remain subject to be redeemed, unless it shall appear by the records, or by receipt of the proper officer, or by a judgment of
