

Chien, in the county of Crawford, on the second Monday of October of each year.

SECTION 3. That hereafter the general terms of the circuit court in and for the eleventh circuit, shall be holden as follows: Eleventh circuit.

In the county of Trempealeau, on the first Monday of April, and the first Monday of November in each year. Trempealeau.

In the county of Buffalo, on the third Monday of April, and the third Monday of September in each year. Buffalo.

In the county of Pepin, on the fourth Monday of April, and the fourth Monday of September in each year. Pepin.

In the county of Eau Claire, on the second Monday of May, and the second Monday of October in each year. Eau Claire.

In the county of Clark, on the first Monday of June, and the fourth Monday of October in each year. Clark.

In the county of Chippewa, on the first Monday of May, and the first Monday of October in each year. Chippewa.

SECTION 4. The said county of Richland is hereby detached from the fifth judicial circuit, and is hereby constituted a part of the sixth judicial circuit. Richland part of sixth circuit.

SECTION 5. All acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force so far as relates to the constituting of the county of Richland a part of the sixth circuit, from and after its passage and publication, but otherwise shall not take effect until the first day of July, A. D. 1861. To take effect.

AN ACT to exempt from taxation a certain lot in the city of Sheboygan.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Lot 6 in block 34, in the city of Sheboygan, is hereby exempted from taxation so long as Exemption.

the same is owned by the Sheboygan rifle company, and used for military purposes only.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 204.

[Published April 16, 1861.]

AN ACT to authorize Frances Julia Ann Emery, a minor, to convey and devise real and personal property, and to transact other business, the same as she might lawfully do, if of lawful age.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Frances Julia
Ann Emery may
hold and convey
real estate.

SECTION 1. Frances Julia Ann Emery, wife of Alonzo L. Emery, formerly Frances Julia Ann Potter, a minor, residing in the town of Windsor, Dane county, Wisconsin, may hold, grant, bargain, sell, release, convey, devise and bequeath real and personal property, and any right, title, interest and estate therein, and the rents, issues and profits thereof; may compromise and settle claims affecting the same; give and receive acquittances, and may transact any other business in like manner and with like force and effect, as if she were of lawful age.

SECTION 2. This act shall and take effect be in force from and after its passage and publication.
