CHAPTER 263.

[Published April 24, 1861.]

AN ACT to authorize the purchase of one thousand copies of the first volume of the Geological Reports of this state.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The governor of the state is hereby authorized and directed to purchase of Professor James Hall one thousand copies of the first volume of his geological report of Wisconsin, confined mainly to the lead region, and to contain between four and five hundred pages. The said volume shall embrace a chapter on the general geology of the state, and its relations to the geology of the surrounding states, with the details of the geology, mineralogy and mining thereof, and shall be the same size, and in all respects as to type, paper and binding, equal to the Iowa geological report, with all necessary maps and illustrations: *provided*, that said one thousand copies, delivered at the capitol in the city of Madison, shall not cost more than three dollars each.

Size of volume, and what to embrace.

SECTION 2. The governor shall designate in the contract for such purchase, the time for the delivery of said copies; and in case the same do not answer the requirements of the contract, as indicated in section one of this act, the state shall be under no obligation to accept the same, nor shall any liability on account thereof exist against the state.

If not according to contract, state not liable.

SECTION 3. The cost of the said copies shall be paid by the treasurer of the state on the warrant of the governor, when the said one thousand copies shall have been delivered and accepted, and the sum of three thousand dollars is hereby appropriated out of any

money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for such purpose.

CHAPTER 264.

[Published April 18, 1861.]

AN ACT to authorize the Secretary of State to audit the account of the architects of the capitol extension, and appropriate a sum of money therein named.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Accounts of A. Kutzbock and Roselle M. Donnell.

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized and directed to audit the account of A. Kutzbock and Roselle M. Donnell, widow of S. H. Donnell, to the amount of three thousand dollars, in full for plans, specifications and estimates for the west wing of the capitol extension, and he is hereby directed to draw his warrant upon the state treasurer for said sum, payable out of the sum appropriated by chapter sixty-six of the general laws of 1861, approved March 9th, 1861; and the state treasurer is hereby directed to pay the same out of the sum appropriated by said act for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and upon the payment thereof, the state treasury shall take a receipt in full of all demands against the state for all plans, specifications and estimates made or required for said west wing; and the said plans, specifications and estimates shall become the property of the state.

How payable.

Appropriation to Roselle M. Donnell.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to Roselle M. Donnell, widow of S. H. Donnell, one of the architects of the capitol extension, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) in full of the interest of said S. H. Donnell for all plans, specifications and estimates for the entire capitol extension, and all extra services and compensation rendered or claimed therefor; and upon the payment thereof, the state treasurer shall take a receipt therefor in full of
