

CHAPTER 270.

[Published April 20, 1861.]

AN ACT to make County Orders payable for certain purposes.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Orders of certain counties receivable for tax certificates and redemption of lands.

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the boards of supervisors of the counties of Wood, Portage and Marathon respectively, to authorize the clerk of the board and the county treasurer of each of said counties, to take the county orders of their county in payment for tax certificates held by the county, and in redemption of lands sold for taxes, and in payment of delinquent taxes returned to the county treasurer.

SECTION 2. In all cases where the board of supervisors of any of said counties has authorized or shall authorize the clerk and treasurer to take county orders, as provided in section one of this act, it shall be the duty of said officers to take the orders of their respective counties, as aforesaid.

SECTION 3. This act shall be published immediately, and take effect from and after its publication.

CHAPTER 271.

[Published April 20, 1861.]

AN ACT to prevent county treasurers from converting to their own use, fees belonging by law to printers.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Fees for printing delinquent lists.

SECTION 1. No county treasurer, for the purpose of converting to his own use or benefit any part of the fees allowed by law for printing delinquent tax lists, shall contract with any printer or publisher of a newspaper for such printing at a less amount than the legal rates now fixed by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.
