

## CHAPTER 307.

[Published April 16, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to provide for the defence of the State, and to aid in enforcing the laws and maintaining the authority of the Federal Government," being Chapter 239 of the General Laws of 1861.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter 239 of the general laws of 1861, is hereby amended so as to read as follows : "The sum of two hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, or out of any money lying idle in the treasury, not belonging to the school fund or school fund income, for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this act, and to defray the expense of transporting troops, and of procuring and transporting arms and munitions of war ; and the same shall be drawn as occasion may require, on the warrant of the governor ; and for the expenditure of the same, he shall file vouchers in the office of the secretary of state, and make a report to the next legislature. And there is hereby appropriated to the governor of this state, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, for his contingent expenses as commander-in-chief, to be drawn from the treasurer on his warrant, as occasion may require, at his discretion."

SECTION 2. Section four of said law is amended by striking out the words "ten years" where they occur in said section, and inserting "five years" in lieu thereof ; also, by striking out the word "one" where it occurs before the word "hundred" in said section, referring to the number of bonds that may be issued, and inserting in lieu thereof the word "two."

Bonds payable in five years.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
