

CHAPTER 247.

[Published April 11, 1862.]

AN ACT to appropriate to the institution for the education of the deaf and dumb, the sum of (\$12,200) twelve thousand two hundred dollars.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The sum of twelve thousand two hundred dollars, is hereby appropriated to the institute for the education of the deaf and dumb, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, being payment in full for the current expenses of the ensuing year, and the support of the indigent pupils. ^{\$12,200.}

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 260.

[Published April 11, 1862.]

AN ACT to provide for depositing certain papers in the quartermaster general and the commissary general's departments, in the office of the secretary of state, and constitute the same legal evidence.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The quartermaster general and the commissary general are hereby authorized and required to deliver all evidences of claims allowed, and all vouchers therefor, filed or remaining in their several departments respectively, paid or payable from the "war fund," to the secretary of state, and the said secretary of state is hereby instructed to deposit and safely keep the same in his office; and the said vouchers shall be received as evidence in all courts, in the same manner and with like effect as the original vouchers now on file in the office of the secretary of state.

Vouchers to be filed with secretary of state, &c.
