CHAPTER 321.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 437 of the private and local laws of 1856, entitled "an act to incorporate the village of Weyauwega."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Chapter four hundred and thirty-seven Repeal. of the private and local laws of 1856, entitled "an act to incorporate the village of Weyauwega," is hereby

repealed.

SECTION 2. The officers of said village, elected by business. virtue of said chapter, shall have full power and authority to complete and finish any unfinished business commenced by them as such officers, and now pending before them, notwithstanding the expiration of their term of office.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of June, A. D. 1862.

CHAPTER 322.

AN ACT to authorize the city of Madison to compromise its bonded indebtedness.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Mad-common council ison are hereby authorized to negotiate and effect a compromise, and to issue new bonds bearing 5 of said city; and for that purpose, are hereby fully em-per cent. interpowered to issue new bonds of said city, payable in twenty years from April 1st, 1862, bearing interest at five per cent. per annum, payable annually, on the first day of April, both interest and principal payable in New York city. Said bonds shall have coupons annexed in the usual form, for the annual payments of
