

CHAPTER 392.

[Published June 19, 1862.]

AN ACT to provide for the reletting [of] the contract for public printing for the year 1862.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The commissioners of public printing, as provided in chapter 315 of the laws of 1860, may relet the contract for public printing, from the date of the passage of this act until the thirty-first day of December, 1862, being the unexpired term of the contract with E. A. Calkins & Co., at such notice as they may deem proper for the public interest, without advertising for six weeks, as now provided by law. ^{Authority to commissioners.}

SECTION 2. The secretary of state shall audit all bills for public printing from the time of the refusal of the late contractors to do the state printing, until the reletting of the contract, as provided in section one of the [this] act, in accordance with the temporary contract made by the commissioners of public printing. ^{Auditing of bills.}

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay the warrants as provided in section 2 of this act. ^{Appropriation.}

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 237 of the general laws of the year 1862, entitled "an act in relation to costs in certain cases."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :
