

and state of Wisconsin, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of the state, are hereby legalized and declared to be valid, for all purposes, the same as though the said John W. Hall and Nicholas Murtrice had caused their official oaths to have been taken and filed in conformity with the laws of this state.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 127.

[Published April 10, 1863.]

AN ACT to amend section one, chapter one hundred and thirty-three, of the revised statutes, entitled "of costs and fees."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Fees for collect-
ing.

SECTION 1. Subdivision seventh of section one of chapter one hundred and thirty-three of the revised statutes, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Collecting and paying over all sums upon execution, writ or process for the collection of money, five per centum upon any sum not exceeding three hundred dollars; upon any sum exceeding three hundred dollars and not exceeding six hundred dollars, five per centum upon the first three hundred dollars, and two and one-half per centum upon the residue thereof; and upon any sum exceeding six hundred dollars, five per centum upon the first three hundred dollars, two and one-half per centum upon the second three hundred dollars, and one and one-fourth per centum upon the residue thereof; but in no case shall the whole per centage exceed the sum of thirty dollars."

SECTION 2. This act shall be published immediately, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
