

## CHAPTER 25.

[Published March 16, 1863.]

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter one hundred and forty-eight of the revised statutes, entitled "of proceedings by and against corporations."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hundred and forty-eight of the revised statutes, entitled "of proceeding by and against corporations," is hereby so amended, as to read as follows: "Actions against corporations may be commenced in the same manner that personal actions are commenced against individuals. The summons or process by which action is commenced, shall be served by delivering a copy thereof to the president or other head of the corporation, secretary, cashier, treasurer, director, or managing agent thereof; and in case any railroad company operating any railroad in this state, and whose general office is not within this state, shall be defendant, the summons or process may be served by delivering a copy thereof to any station or ticket agent in the employ of said company, in this state; but such service can be made in respect to a foreign corporation, only when it has property within this state, or the cause of action arose therein."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
