on any other day to hold and make an election in such manner as shall be provided for in the by-laws of said corporation, and may fix the number of directors at any number not less than three nor more than five.

SECTION 5. The directors of said corporation shall other omcers, have power to appoint such officers and agents as they by-laws, &c. may deem necessary, and prescribe their duties, and take the necessary bonds for the faithful performance thereof; and may from time to time adopt such by-laws and regulations for the business of said corporation as they may deem expedient, such by-laws and regulations not to be inconsistent with the constitution and laws of the United States or of this state.

SECTION 6. It is hereby declared that in the judg-Objects not otherwise attainment of the legislature the objects of this corporation able.

cannot be attained by or under general laws.

SECTION 7. This act is hereby declared to be a pub-Pablic act, &c. lic act, and its provisions shall be liberally and favorably construed in all courts; and copies of the same, printed by authority of law, shall be received as evidence thereof in all cases.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Wildwood cemetery association," approved March 10th, 1855.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of an act entitled "an act Change of corpeto incorporate the Wildwood cemetery association," is hereby amended, by striking out the names [of] Samuel L. Rose, M. D. Miller, [and] J. W. Robinson, and inserting in said section, in the place thereof, the names [of] Reese Evans, J. J. Miter and E. C. McFetridge.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.
